

Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN)
Internal Transfer Application
(For students already enrolled at Longwood University)

Longwood's Nursing Program is designed as a four-year program with entry at the freshman level. There is no guarantee space will be available for students to transfer into the major. Students who are accepted to transfer into the program typically begin at the freshman level.

To be considered for sophomore entry, students must have approximately 30 credits completed towards the Nursing 4-year plan and must have completed Biology 206 and 207: Human Anatomy and Physiology I and II with a grade of C or better. Students who qualify for second year entry would need to have taken first year nursing course, NURS 100, or plan to take it during the summer semester prior to the start of the second year.

Applications for internal transfer students will be reviewed for admission to the program prior to the start of the spring and fall semesters after grades have been posted for the semester of application. Applications to transfer for spring semester are due December 1; applications to transfer for fall semester are due June 1.

The Nursing Admissions Committee will review applicants' high school and college transcripts and personal statements. As part of the review process, standardized test scores may be considered when available. Alternatively, applicants may be evaluated based on grades earned in relevant college course work (e.g., statistics, chemistry).

If applicants have 24 or more credits after high school graduation, high school transcript and test score information is not required to be submitted.

To be considered for admission, applicants must have the following:

- Preferred high school GPA of 3.2
- Minimum college GPA of 2.75; preferred college GPA of 3.0
- Preferred BIOL 206 & 207 with a grade of C or better (required to be considered for sophomore entry)
- Preferred standardized test scores will be reviewed with minimum scores as follows:
 - SAT composite score of 1000, math portion 500
 - ACT 20
 - TEAS 65
- Preferred MATH 155 or MATH 171 with a grade of C or better
