**Key Terms:**

**CSD Foundations:** Foundation Courses are CSD classes that are below the level of CSDS 314.

**The CSD Bridge:** All students must complete the requirements listed under the CSD Bridge before they may take courses at the level of CSDS 314 and beyond. The CSD Bridge Requirements are listed on page 3 in this document.

**CSD Connections:** Once you have met the CSD Bridge requirements, then you may register for and take those CSD classes beginning at CSDS 314 and above.

**Other:**

**Repeating Any CSD Course:** Any student who is majoring or minoring in CSD may elect to repeat any CSDS course only once. There is a maximum of five (5) total repeats allowed for all CSD undergraduate courses.

**SPED & EDUC Courses:** You should complete all of these courses by your junior year.

**USING THIS CSD COURSE OF STUDY:** This CSD Course of Study is designed to be used as a guide only. There may be some classes listed for some Perspectives, Pillars, or under Diversity that you are not eligible to take -- **you must verify whether a course will count for you by looking up that course in the Longwood Undergraduate Catalog for the year you entered Longwood University.** For example, not all CSD students can take BIOL 114 to count towards Pillar 6; some of you can only count BIOL 101. Again, you have

to verify the courses you need by FIRST looking at your undergraduate catalog. **Note that All CSD students must take CSD courses that are listed in the Course of Study (this doesn't change).**
