<b>CARDBOARD<sup>ii</sup></b>

<sup>i</sup> Magnet will not stick to aluminum.

<sup>ii</sup> All cardboard must be flattened prior to collection.

<sup>iii</sup> Corrugated means there are holes in the side of the cardboard.

<sup>iv</sup> Chipboard is cardboard that is not corrugated, such as cereal boxes, tissue boxes, backing for notebooks and notepads, etc.
